Everyone will need:

- ❖ Lots of spare clothes!
- ❖ **Outdoor and indoor shoes**
- ❖ Waterproofs
- ❖ Sun block
- ❖ Plastic water bottle
- ❖ Baseball cap/sun hat
- ❖ Bobble Hat & Gloves (depending on season)
- ❖ Washbag, toiletries and towel
- ❖ Pen and notebook
- ❖ Any medication that you will require throughout your stay
- ❖ Head Torch (preferred) or Torch

Yurts/Cabins (indoor camping with no heating):

Please bring:

- ❖ Single bottom sheet
- ❖ Sleeping bag
- ❖ Pillow case
- ❖ Extra blanket/fleece
- ❖ Bobble Hat and thick socks – for sleeping in! 😊
- ❖ Optional: Hot Water Bottle or Microwavable Heat 'Buddy'

Things to Leave Behind:

- ❖ Electronics e.g. iPods, Phones, Tablets
- ❖ Expensive jewellery & clothes

What to wear



For all activities:

- Wear comfortable sports clothing (which allows free movement)
- Bring a water bottle
- Put on sun cream
- Bring a sun hat
- Bring your Inhaler (even if you don't use it often)
- And.... NO flip-flops or crocs please!

Climbing

- Tie back long hair, remove jewellery
- Wear trainers
- Waterproofs trousers and jacket



Fencing

- Long trousers and t shirt
- Hair tied back

Sports shoes/trainers, no sandals or flip-flops



Archery

- Clothes to protect from sun, rain or cold-depending on the day
- Closed toe shoes-no sandals or flip-flops
- Tie back long hair
- Remove large earrings



Biking

- Long trousers
- Long sleeved top
- Trainers
- Waterproof jacket and trousers

Walking/Hiking

- Comfortable clothes
- Trainers / Hiking boots
- Waterproof trousers and jacket
- Spare jumper
- Snacks / Food



Low Ropes / General Sports / Team Games

- Comfortable clothes
- Trainers, no sandals or flip-flops
- For Low Ropes - long trousers



Watersports:

Canoeing/Kayaking/Rafting/SUP

- Clothing you can get wet
- Shoes you can get wet/muddy
- No Jeans
- No flip flops - they fall off if you fall in!
- Warm top
- Complete change of dry clothes
- Towel
- Warm hat and gloves



Medical Needs

Please list the medication/s (including prescription, non prescription and herbal) that you will be handing in to be taken on the trip. (These should come from home)

Medications held in school will **not** be taken on the trip.

ALL MEDICATION MUST BE HANDED IN TO A MEMBER OF STAFF on the morning of the trip.

Medication that is not listed on the form, will not be accepted.
