Introduction

Perhaps most importantly, a uniform means pupils don't have to worry about peer pressure when it comes to their clothes. When everyone is dressed the same, worrying about what you look like isn't so important. Wearing uniform shows that you are part of our school community. It's important to look smart, neat and tidy.

Everyday wear

- Royal blue cardigan / jumper with school logo
- White shirt / polo shirt
- Smart grey trousers / shorts (Nursery may wear tracksuit bottoms)
- Grey skirts/skorts or pinafores
- Pale blue and white check summer dress/culottes/skorts
- White or grey socks
- Black shoes or plain black trainers with no logos (velcro shoes are preferable for children in EYFS)
- **No** denim jeans, denim skirts or track suit bottoms



PE kit for Reception and Years 1-6

On PE lesson days, children in Reception and Years 1-6 should come to school dressed in their PE kits.

Families will be informed of the class PE days at the beginning of term.

- Black shorts or skort / grey jogging bottoms
- Plimsolls or black trainers
- T-shirt with embroidered school crest in the child's house colour (blue / green / red / yellow).

PE kit for Nursery

Children in Nursery do have PE lessons but they do not change for these. They wear their house colour t-shirt in the summer term; therefore, new parents are advised to delay purchasing these until the end of the Nursery year.

Jewellery

- Small studs may be worn if children have pierced ears (for their safety hoops & sleepers cannot be worn)
- Religious pendants or bracelets may be worn
- KS2 children may wear watches (no Smart watches)

Head wear and hair

- Long hair should be styled up and out of the face. This is to reduce the likelihood of spreading head lice.
- Scarves and hats worn for religious purposes - please ensure that they are white, black or blue and tone in with school uniform colours.
- Hair bands, hair clips, hair bobbles, scrunchies can be worn – please ensure that they are white, black or blue and tone in with school uniform colours.

Make-up

Make-up is not acceptable under any circumstances, including nail varnish and fake tattoos. Children with temporary tattoos or nail varnish may be assisted to remove them.


Purchasing & caring for uniform
